

Vicente who heard the Gospel about nine months ago at our outreach is now a regular attender. After years of drinking, he's put down the bottle and told me he's found a family there at the church. He goes in to the hospital weekly for his kidney dialysis, and in the waiting room often encourages people to thank God for the blessings He's given them. He tells whoever will listen about the things the Lord has done for Him!

How do faces in the crowd at our outreaches become faces in our churches? Our Spectrum staff works tirelessly to love, help and encourage the people we work with, sharing the Gospel in both word and in deed. You read newsletters just like this one, staying up to date with the ministry, praying, supporting and sometimes coming down to partner with us in the work. It takes a loving pastor like Juan to teach and shepherd his people in
