Two years later, her and her husband auctioned their house, gave their cars away, and got on a plane to run a school and an orphanage in South Sudan. John from California comes to mind. Before his trip, his pastor asked him to pray about starting a college ministry at his church. He was planning to say no, but while here God touched his heart and today they have a thriving young adult ministry there. And what happened to Kevin? He graduated from college, and six years ago replaced me as youth pastor at the
