Sometimes stuff in the Bible just seems weird. I was reading in Mark 7 today and when healing a deaf and mute

man, in verses 33-35 it says, "...Jesus put His fingers into the man's ears. Then He spit and touched the man's tongue. He looked up to heaven and with a deep sigh said to him, "Ephphatha!" (which means, "Be opened!"). At this the man's ears were opened, his tongue was loosened and he began to speak plainly."

Really Jesus?!? Were the fingers in the ears and the spit and the touching of the man's tongue necessary? I wonder what the deaf/mute man thought was happening to him? Couldn't Jesus just have said the word, and brought back the man's hearing and voice? We've seen Jesus do it before!

But then I thought, maybe there was a method behind what Jesus was doing here. If Jesus simply said, 'Be opened.' The man wouldn't have heard it because he was deaf. Through touch Jesus communicated with the man what He was doing in a personal way the man could under-

stand. Jesus knew exactly what was needed to speak without words and engage with him about what he was about to do in his life.

Christmas is a special time for us here in our neighborhoods and in our ministry and kids look forward to it throughout the year. It really is a chance for us to speak love into the lives of the families we work with!

It also might seem weird that I'm writing about Christmas in October. The thing is, we're working to get the best prices and selection possible for the 1,200 kids we'll serve. To do so, we've made a great connection with a toy warehouse in LA. But their stock can run out quick. Ordering just the right toys and transporting them across the border means that we need to start the process now to be ready. We've been able to find quality toys at a low cost. We will also take any toys you wish to purchase yourself and donate. In the end, it will take about \$6,000 to purchase enough toys for all of the kids.
