Hard news often hits us when we do not expect it. In a moment, it can change our lives. Liliana, a mother of two from the Ejido Lazaro Cardenas neighborhood, shared the news she received several weeks ago. The growth in her body had been confirmed to be cancer. The treatment needed to start immediately. The doctor told her that she would need to prepare herself for life in a wheelchair. Even if she survived, the wheelchair could be permanent. Her neighborhood is all dirt roads and hills. This was hard news. The tears in her eyes were such a sharp contrast to the joy we shared as we built a home for her family last September. She was so overwhelmingly happy then. I assured

her we would try to help fit the home with a ramp for the wheelchair. As she cried she told me that she knew God would take care of her, and that He had the final word, but they had already started to make preparations. She is a Christian and her faith would sustain her even in this time.

I saw her again at our last visit to Ejido. She said, "I didn't want to send this electronically in a phone message."

She held several papers in her hand. She started to cry as she explained, "Look, it says it right here, no cancer is detected, no cancer is detected." She showed me page after page of test results. She had the old page from when the cancer was detected, and the new tests which now bewildered the doctors. The cancer was gone without a trace. She told me through tears that God had saved her, and she knew God would not abandon her. "All I could say in the hospital was praise God, praise God!" We shared some hugs, tears, and prayers of thanks. God showered some of His grace on this little family from Ejido once again. We share in her spirit of gratitude and praise. Just in time for Christmas!
